Storylines Te Kahurangi Kāterina Te Heikōkō Mataira Guidelines

Entries to be received by 31 October each year

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Te Reo Māori:

General criteria apply as for the genres as stated below, with special consideration given to the following:

- · Does the book portray the Māori world view?
- · Are te reo me ona tikanga (language and customs) expressed to a high standard?
- · Is the language used evidently of high standard, with a rich vocabulary, correct grammar and the orthography following Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori guidelines?
- · How relevant and resolved is the story for the intended age and audience?

Picture book (Note that 'school readers' and other educational material for primary children written in te reo Māori can be submitted in this category for the award.)

Elements to be considered:

- Will the text and story appeal to children up to about 8 years of age?
- Is the language used appropriate for the intended age group?
- If in rhyme, is the rhythm consistent and does it read well aloud?
- Does the text work on different levels for different audiences?
- What is the overall impact of the MS on the reader?

Fiction

Junior fiction for primary and intermediate-aged children. Young adult fiction for upper intermediate and secondary school students.

Elements to be considered:

- Is the plot well-constructed and does it make sense?
- Are the characters and their behaviour believable, convincing and consistent, and allow for growth and development?
- Do the narrative and dialogue work together?
- Does the author's language convey a sense of place, character, atmosphere, etc.

Non-fiction:

Poetry, folklore, retellings of myths and legends are included in this category.

Elements to be considered:

- Is the topic and information suitable for the target age group?
- Is the text authoritative, accurate and clear?
- Is the language appropriate for the intended age group?
- Does the text's general tone indicate that it is for the general young reader i.e. not for a textbook intended primarily for classroom use?
