This fortunately did not impact on our ability to work with *WhatNow* on the Storylines Kids' Pick competition. This is a continuing area of engagement that is greatly valued. We were also fortunate enough to attend the awarding of the Storylines Betty Gilderdale Award and hear Lorraine Orman present her speech in November 2020 at the School of Music auditorium at the Epsom Campus of the University of Auckland. I am sure formany of you it felt like we were coming out of a long tunnel and had a little more confidence that any planning we undertook would eventuate.

This brings me to thanking and acknowledging the work done by the Storylines Management Committee who do the planning, developing, and organising of Friends' initiatives.
